## **Property News:**

You will soon notice new light fixtures throughout the building that our hard-working property team is in the process of installing. So nice are these new fixtures, in fact, that we can now SEE some other things in need of repair (namely, the Church Library could use a fresh coat of paint!). We put out the call and got some immediate response from volunteers, so we will have a freshly painted library before long thanks to members donating their time and talents.

We are still working on figuring out the best place to put an elevator / lift to aid members who might benefit from assistance in getting into the building. There will be more to come on this, but suffice to say there are innumerable rules and regulations that could impact this decision.

There are, in fact, two pretty major items before Trinity this year that we prayerfully ask you to consider supporting. We have been very blessed as a congregation from a financial perspective, and paying off the mortgage early this year was a great example of that. We are hoping to tackle two new projects without going into debt, and we ask that you consider helping to support one or both of these projects. The first is the elevator / lift that we are considering. While we are still exploring our options here, we are likely to encounter costs for this that exceed the very generous donation that was made last year to Trinity. If you are inclined and able to help fund this project, please use a designated offering envelope with "Lift" in the subject line of your check.

The second fairly major expense we are likely to encounter sooner than later is the need to replace our organ. Our congregation bought the current organ in 1972 for about \$15,000 and it has served us remarkably well. The useful life of an organ is 30 or more years, and we're on 42 and counting! But we are probably on borrowed time at this point, so we are asking members to consider helping us build an organ replacement fund with hopes that by the time we need to replace the organ, we will have enough to buy one without a loan. A new organ is likely to cost in the \$35,000 - \$40,000 range. If you are interested in helping Trinity with this, please use a designated offering envelope with "Organ" in the subject line of your check.

Last, if you listen closely you'll hear the carillon working again. This was fixed by Dan Bay using materials he already had and is a welcome (re)addition to the sounds of Trinity. Thanks, Dan!
