<u>Updates from Jeff McDonald, Council President</u>: Our office move project that began with Pastor Hoag taking over the Youth Room and the Youth moving to the basement has now culminated with Judi moving into Pastor Hoag's old office and Judi's former office (our long-standing secretary's office) turning into a general use office for the church. Our various groups (Sunday School, Church Council, Youth, Social Ministry, etc.) will be able to use the office now, and we are also able to move our choir music cabinets out of the attic and store them in the office as well. Counting of our offerings can resume in the office as well now that this project is complete, so the ultimate goal of making better use of our existing space has been achieved. The final stage of this was to replace the carpeting in these last two offices, and we opted to replace the stained carpeting in our library as well. All five of the upstairs rooms now have new carpeting, and we opted to install carpet squares so that we can replace squares if and when that becomes necessary. It's been a steady improvement, and the finished product looks great! Our thanks to all involved in this project, with particular thanks to Jeff Lorenz, Dan Bay & Virgil Switzer for their many hours of work on this project.

July involved an unexpected purchase of a new air conditioning unit for our balcony. This was the oldest of our A/C units at Trinity, and it reached the end of its useful life rather abruptly in July. We were able to replace this unit with a new unit that is much quieter and more efficient as well. Our A/C units are now all fairly new, so hopefully we can get several years out of them before we need any additional A/C service calls.

I mentioned last month that we were waiting for a revised bid for our windows and that remains true as of this writing, although they have been out to reassess our needs and we expect to have a bid from them shortly. I have received strong support from several members about turning our attention to the fellowship hall kitchen if we elect not to proceed with a full window restoration, so that remains a good probability if we can find a way to make that work. I expect to have all of the figures available by the time Church Council meetings resume in September.

<u>Vacation Bible School –</u> Vacation Bible School was held June 25-29, 9:30-Noon. Our theme was Splash Canyon and we had 150 children from the age of 3 up through 5th grade attend.

The mission this year at VBS is "Water to Thrive". This mission builds wells in Africa to provide fresh, clean water to villagers who would otherwise have to walk many miles, both ways, to have clean water to drink for their families. It takes \$5,000.00 to bring a well to a village.

The children who attended our VBS Program this year, raised \$907.69 toward a new well in Africa. If we raise \$1,000.00, the amount will go toward a well to be started soon. If we raise less than \$1,000.00, the money will go toward planning a well project.

The total raised so far with VBS and congregational giving is \$2,079.06.
