As you might know, Galatians was a favorite of Martin Luther's because of its emphasis on Christian freedom. Yes, the law of God is good. Yes, the law of God is wise. But the law of God pointed beyond itself to the time when it would be kept perfectly the way God intended. That was accomplished by Jesus Christ! He did what we are unable to do. That fact alone unburdens our often guilty consciences.

We'll be continuing this sermon series throughout the summer, so you'll want to stay tuned to see what happens. But just to whet your appetite a bit, St. Paul (the author of Galatians) begs and pleads the Galatians to turn back to the good news of Jesus Christ they received from him instead of living by the "weak and miserable principles" of their former lives of idolatry and false worship. Those who insist that the Galatians follow a set of regulations are actually leading them into very slavery from which they've been set free.

The Christian faith is not a cold list of "do's and don'ts". Period. The Christian is FREE! However, St. Paul will explain that this is not a license to gratify the sinful nature (selfishness). That would be a gross misunderstanding of the Gospel, the Good News. Rather, the Christian in joy will produce "the fruit of the Spirit".
