We just had a very successful Vacation Bible School!

Update from Church Council President, Jeff McDonald.

I want to give you an update on our stained glass window repair project. We made the logical conclusion that the visible bowing of our windows was the reason our lower windows no longer opened and closed. There are some windows in our church where the bowing is worse than others, but we recently received some unexpected news from one of the contractors bidding on this project. In his opinion, the bowing that has occurred so far is not the reason our lower windows aren't working. Citing the fact that our windows are encased in stone frames (as opposed to wood frames, as was the case with the Methodist church in town), he explained to us that the bowing we have experienced to date shouldn't get much worse as it would require deterioration of the surrounding stone frames for that to occur. In his expert opinion, he feels our windows should last another 20-30 years before they need to be redone. He provided us with a bid at our request, but when asked if he would redo the windows now if this were his home church, he admitted that he would not. At least one other contractor commented that our windows were in relatively good shape given their age.

So, where does that leave us? Well, the good news is that we will eventually need to have this project done and we have already funded most, if not all, of the cost of this project. So please be assured that the money so many of you donated to this project will eventually be used for this project if we do elect to

put this off. But doing this earlier than is required really doesn't serve us any purpose since the windows are in better shape than we realized.

In the meantime, our windows still don't open and close and a few of the small panes are cracked. What we are seeking now is a revised bid for minor repairs to our windows. That would include replacement of any missing mortar, replacement of any cracked panes, and repair of our opening/closing mechanisms so that we can open and close the windows again. Another contractor suggested we reverse the lower windows so that they open out instead of in, and that is another option we are considering. The eventual direction we go here will depend on the costs of these revised bids, but it appears the total restoration of these windows can wait. While I will admit this is not the outcome I expected, I don't want to proceed with a repair that is not currently needed. Trust that we will review these additional bids and work with council to arrive at the best possible solution for our building.

I apologize for this change in direction, but this is truly not what we expected to hear. In fact, the contractor informing us that he would not restore our windows at this point did so at his own peril. He wanted more than \$58,000 for this job yet he stood in our church and admitted that if this were his church, he would not restore the windows yet. While I feel our initial logic was sound, I don't want to ignore this new information that we would be better served to wait to complete this work.

One final thought for now is that we could consider using these funds toward restoring our kitchen in fellowship hall. We know that project is needed and that was intended to be the next project after the windows were restored. We will give consideration to this idea as well and see if perhaps we could use some of our stained glass funds on the kitchen now and then work to rebuild that fund for when the actual restoration is needed. If you have questions or other thoughts on this, I am open to your input.
