The Season of Lent has finally arrived, and with it extra worship services to help us sharpen our focus on the mercy of God toward sinners. This year we will be exploring Psalm 51, the great penitential Psalm of David. Each Wednesday evening, we will look at a couple of verses from the Psalm, hear what Martin Luther had to say about the verses, and then see that we have nothing of ourselves that reconciles us to God or earns His grace. We only have shelter in the mercy of God, which is the primary theme of the Psalm. That is what makes Psalm 51 so sweet. It's relief for the burdened soul.

The Word of God reveals to us God's righteous anger at our sins from which we have no escape. This wrath is eternal and everlasting. The Word of God also reveals that God is merciful and faithful. His mercy and faithfulness are also eternal and everlasting, and finally given to us freely through a person, the Godman Jesus Christ. He endured the eternal wrath of God on the cross on our behalf, so that we could enjoy the everlasting mercy of God. Psalm 51 beautifully lays this out!

Our Lenten services begin on Ash Wednesday, March 1, at 7:30pm. Come, be fed and encouraged, and know the immensity of God's grace through Jesus for you!

Lenten Series 2017

In commemoration of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, we will have a special sermon series during the Lenten Midweek Services.

Have Mercy on Me, O God: Martin Luther on Psalm 51 is the title of the series. Psalm 51 is the great lament Psalm of King David when he was confronted by the prophet Nathan about his adultery with Bathsheba and the murder of Bathsheba's husband, Uriah the Hittite. Luther wrote at length about the Psalm three times during his life and gleans so much meaning and significance about the nature of repentance, the knowledge of man, and the knowledge of God. Each week we will explore portions of Psalm 51 and hear Luther's great insights for our own Lenten journey of penitence and being embraced by the great mercy of God through Jesus Christ.

Ash Wednesday, March 1: When Mercy Is All That We Can Ask For (Psalm 51:1-2)

Midweek 2, March 8: God's Judgment is Justified (Psalm 51:3-5)

Midweek 3, March 15: God Seeks Truth (Psalm 51:6-8)

Midweek 4, March 22: A New Creation by the Mercy of God (Psalm 51:9-13)

Midweek 5, March 29: God Opens Lips to Praise His Mercy (Psalm 51:14-15)

Midweek 6: April 5: Sacrifices by the Mercy of God (Psalm 51:16-19)

<u>Financial Report:</u> The congregation adopted a 2017 General Fund Budget of \$209,541.58 at its Annual Meeting on January 29th. The Budget is 1% higher than the 2016 budget, the Council deemed the adjustment warranted to cover expected operating costs. A salary increases of 3% was approved for Pastor. Primary support of the General Fund by the congregation is very important to meeting Trinity's ongoing needs.

Our congregation was truly blessed with financial support during 2016. General Fund receipts, that were higher than in 2015, and special donations allowed the payment of all commitments. We want to thank everyone for their support of Trinity Lutheran Church and its missions.
