Dear Friends of Trinity,

Put a mark on Thursday, May 9, on your calendars. When you go to do this you will see that it is more than likely already marked for you with the words *Ascension Day*. Did you know that Ascension Day is the third most important festival in the Christian Church (the other two being Christmas and Easter)? What's so important about it?

We could very easily fall into the trap of thinking that Jesus abandoned us when he ascended to heaven, and many churches will actually teach this. But in the ascension Jesus did not withdraw his presence. He transformed it, meaning that he became the permanent link between heaven and earth. These two realms are now inseparable and completes what was begun at Christmas—the marriage of heaven and earth. Nothing can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus. That's the good news of the ascension!

If there were Smartphones or video cameras back then to record the event, then we would know exactly what it looked like. But there weren't so we don't. We could speculate as many artists have done and create beautiful paintings. But it wasn't the visual sense that ultimately mattered. What's vitally important is the function which the ascension serves in the Bible. And so we ask the question, "What was God telling us in this event?" For that we take a look at how the event was interpreted, and for that we take a look at a breathtaking interpretation in the book of Hebrews:

...we have such a high priest, one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, a minister in the holy places, in the true tent (tabernacle, temple) that the Lord set up, not man. (8:1-2)

Jesus' ascension tells us that he is now our High Priest, presenting himself as sacrifice before his Father in God's true temple in heaven and that he has become the mediator of the new covenant in which iniquity is forgiven and sin is remembered no more (8:12). The old covenant, which condemns us for our sin, is rendered obsolete and is vanishing away (8:13). Put simply, Jesus "sealed the deal" of God granting eternity to His people, both now and always. Jesus now holds the place of ultimate authority, seated at the right hand of the Father. He accomplishes this as fully human. In a very real way we have ascended with him. We have been given an elevated status in Christ, from sinner to saint! The implications of this are staggering, so I'll offer one and invite you to think it through.

You and I are now, as people in Christ Jesus, the record of the ascension event. You are the video! Your entire being and existence now serves as the visual aid of what an ascended humanity looks like. You will see that you don't look any different than anyone else. And that's the point! Your renewal takes place on the inside as you have been given the treasure of the light of Jesus Christ in the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. You have these as a right now, eternal and heavenly gift that you are invited to give away to others. As you do that, your own supply is never depleted because you have a great High Priest, eternal in the heavens, who has linked you to the Fountain and Source of all goodness. Staggering! How that will look in your life cannot be dictated to you by me simply because I don't walk in your shoes. But I do invite you to think all of this through. What would this look like in all dimensions of your life? This could serve as the way to make sense of all of your daily activities, tying them together and unifying them under one Head. It very well could lead to decompartmentalizing (if there is such a word) your life.

<u>CHURCH COUNCIL</u>: Council meetings are scheduled for the second Sunday of the month but due to May 12th being Mother's Day, the meeting has been moved to **Sunday, May 19th** at 7:00 p.m.

Financial Secretary's and Treasurer's 1st Quarter Report. The congregation adopted a 2013 General Fund Budget of \$196,472 at its Annual Meeting on January 27. The Budget is 4.6% higher than contributions made to the General Fund in 2012. The Council deemed the increase warranted to cover expected higher operating costs. A modest salary increase of 2% was granted to Pastor, the Secretary, Organist and Choir Director. Primary support of the General Fund by the congregation is very important to meeting Trinity's ongoing needs.

During the quarter, all due bills were paid. Budgeted contributions were made to Missions and LCCF. General Fund receipts that were about 10"% higher than those received during the same period last year – the difference being mainly that Easter was in March this year. This helped to offset higher than budgeted expenses. The balance on the original \$100,000 mortgage, used to finance the new restrooms, was \$19,847.68 at March 31. Feed My Starving Children In partnership with Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Frankfort, we are again planning to assist in a community-wide effort to raise funds to help feed some of the more than 925 million people in the world who are chronically hungry. Feed My Starving Children (<u>www.fmsc.org</u>) is working to end hunger with the help of volunteers around the globe.

This is a Christian nonprofit hunger relief organization working with volunteers to produce Manna Pack Rick, a scientifically formulated food formula that is culturally acceptable worldwide. They are able to produce these meals at a cost of just 22 cents each (even lower than last year!), but to keep their costs down, they need volunteers.

More than 25 members of our congregation volunteered last year to spend time packing meals at Good Shepherd Lutheran for this effort, where 116,640 meals were packed. Donations also poured in from members of Trinity in the total amount of \$1,669.87. Our donations added to the rest of what was raised for a grand total of more than \$25,660, enough to cover 100% of the cost of these meals. This was an incredibly rewarding experience for all involved, but if you missed it last year (or want to do this again), you will get another chance to participate this year.

This year's event is expected to be even bigger than last year. They have moved the venue to Lincolnway West High School, where they hope to pack 200,000 meals! This event will take place on August 9th and 10th and we plan to support them both in supplying volunteers to help pack meals and in helping them to raise the \$44,000 they will need to pay for these meals.
