## Update from Council President, Jeff McDonald

April was a busy month at Trinity, starting with Easter Sunday and then including a fifth Sunday at the end of the month. We had four baptisms this month and had great attendance throughout the month. We finished up our fundraising efforts for the Lutheran Church Charities K-9 Comfort Dog program and we managed to raise a total of \$3,600 for this worthwhile cause! Many thanks to all who participated in our fundraising for this organization. They will be very appreciative of our financial support.

We also received our fourth bid for our stained glass windows and are in the process of comparing the bids now. Our bids range from about \$45,000 to about \$62,000 and they vary in the extent of what they entail. The old Methodist church in town is in the process of having their windows restored as well, but at 119 years of age, there is considerably more repair needed on their windows. While our situation at Trinity is less dire, this is a job that does require our attention and I'm very happy to see such great

support for this project by our members. We hope to have a contractor selected in the next month or so and we remain hopeful that this can be completed yet this year.

We continue moving forward with the office moves, and new office furniture for what will eventually be the church secretary's office (mostly cabinets - we are reusing as much of the current furniture as possible) is on order. The only other major project that is on our radar is to renovate the kitchen in the fellowship hall. Once we get the windows restored, we plan to turn our attention to the kitchen and then hopefully take a breather from major projects (for a LONG time!). With a building this old, though, there are sure to be other needs along the way. Our thanks again to all of our members who rally their support for these projects. Doing this all without incurring any additional debt has been a tremendous blessing.

Finally, we had a presentation in April from our member, Mark Razny, about emergency and disaster planning. Drawing on his long history of work in law enforcement, Mark volunteered to help us to put together a disaster plan for any host of things we could be faced with - ranging from weather events such as a tornado to an active shooter. While we all hope to never need any such plan, we agreed at council that it would be better to plan for it now than when it might actually be needed. We had lively discussions around this presentation and a few people have already stepped up to volunteer on this committee.
