Dear Friends of Trinity,

How do you know when you've forgiven someone? Do you know what forgiveness really is?

Forgiveness is not excusing, approving, or allowing the bad things other people do to you. These are trivial cultural expressions of forgiveness that are actually parodies of the real thing. They simply won't do.

Real forgiveness demands more from you. Contrary to popular opinion, forgiveness is definitely not designed to benefit the forgiver, but the forgiven. It's costly because it's sacrificial and, dare I say, humiliating. It takes a humble stance to practice real forgiveness.

In the Scriptures, forgiveness is spoken of in terms of "cancelling a debt". It means to release the offender from any and all obligations toward the offended. When you tell someone you forgive them, you are saying that they don't owe you anything. That is, if you are really and truly forgiving that person. The debt can come in different forms: monetary, physical, emotional, spiritual, or mental. While still acknowledging the pain that was inflicted on you, you choose not to retaliate in kind because you have cancelled the debt owed to you.

We were indebted to God because of our sinful and rebellious ways against Him. We owed Him our very lives. In love for us, God paid our debt Himself by the death of Jesus on the cross. That is good news! This serves as the template for forgiveness as it is played out in our lives. We cancel the debt of others by assuming the debt ourselves! We do this simply because we have been forgiven by God beyond measure and imagination. Forgiving others is the appropriate response to the forgiveness we receive through Jesus Christ.

We receive the gift of forgiveness won for us by Christ's death and resurrection through Word and Sacrament. Come often to receive these wondrous blessings God gives to us freely.

The cost will be \$7 a person or \$35 a family (2 adults and children). The date this year is Sunday, **October 9 at 1 o'clock**.


