Dear Friends of Trinity,

First and foremost, I want to say thank you to the congregation for your sympathies and condolences at the death of my Mother. She died very peacefully on Wednesday, September 11, surrounded by her four children. She struggled for the past 4 years with vascular dementia, a disease that has no cure and very little options for treatment. While she had periods of great lucidity, she was mostly downtrodden in mind and spirit while being confined to wheelchair and bed. I have many fond memories and I will dearly miss her.

Most people go to cemeteries at the gravesite of their deceased loved ones to spend some time in their presence. There is a need people have to be in close proximity with those they love, ever after they have died. But did you know there's a place where people can be even closer to their departed loved ones? There is!

It's the place where people join their voices "with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven" giving praise and thanks, proclaiming the holiness of the glory of the Lord. It's the place where heaven meets earth in the ongoing fellowship of all saints, living and departed. It's the place where the banquet of heavenly food is served by Christ Jesus, our Great High Priest, as he gives us his body and blood in bread and wine. It's the place where those living and departed join hearts and voices together in the glorious liturgy of heaven and partake of the peace which surpasses all human understanding.

Have you figured out the place yet?

If you said "at church" you would be correct. There's no place like it! It's where we are served by Christ in the divine gifts of the Channels of Grace—the means through which God gives his gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. In worship we receive provisionally what our loved ones in heaven are receiving fully. In Christ, death does not separate us from those we love who have died in the faith. The worship of the church is designed to bring together these ancient and modern voices in a festive chorus of praise and thanks.

If you have deceased loved ones (who doesn't?), come to church and picture them standing next to you and joining you as you speak, sing, listen, and receive in the Divine Service. It's not weird or morbid. It expresses the great truth that there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Not even death. See you in church!
