God bless you in the month of October!

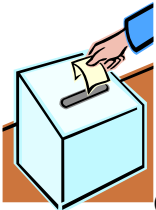

Church Council Elections are approaching at the end of October. If you have

Council is a great and rewarding way to become more involved with the church.

75th Anniversary - *We are hoping to tackle two significant improvements as part of our 75th anniversary.* Both are long-needed improvements to our church, but both will involve a fairly

large investment by our congregation. We hope to have a lift installed and we hope to raise enough funds to purchase a new organ for the church. We have received a number of memorial funds over the years for these projects, but we are projecting the total cost to be greater than what we have available. *We prayerfully ask that all members consider supporting one or both of these projects so that we can complete them both without incurring any additional debt.*

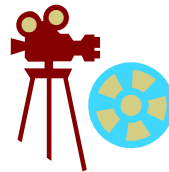
