Have you given more thought to my question that I asked back in June? My question was: What does it mean to you to be Lutheran? If I remember correctly I said that I would eventually give you my answer to the question. So, here we go!

To me being a Lutheran means that I cannot by own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

Did those words have a familiar ring to them? It's the explanation to the Third Article of the Apostle's Creed in Martin Luther's Small Catechism!

Okay, so they aren't my own words. I like Luther's words much better and I can use them anytime. But they indicate a very profound truth in how God makes Christians. Can you see that truth? It's this: that becoming a follower of Christ is totally and completely God's work, not ours. We are completely passive. We cannot believe in Jesus by our own strength because our own strength steers us **away** from Jesus. It takes an act of God to place us on Christ's path. God does this work most powerfully through His Word. We are called by the Good News of Jesus and made holy by the work of the Holy Spirit. And you had nothing to do with it!

Lutherans make their stand on that unmovable and unwavering truth. All glory and honor belongs to God, and God alone. To inject and give credit to any human effort is to actually steal some of God's glory and honor and place it upon ourselves.

Did you know that Luther's Small Catechism is in the hymnal? It's on pages 321-330. Take a look at it sometime and read (or re-read) a simple explanation of the Christian faith as it is exercised by Lutherans.

Gory to God alone!

Summer is over, school is back in session, it's time to get back to our regular fall schedules. Our church groups are ready to go to. Information about our organization/groups is in this newsletter and can also be found on our website: www.trinitynewlenox.org. Members of our church are all encouraged to get involved in one or more of our organizations. Joining one of these groups is a great opportunities to get acquainted with fellow church members.

We will be back on our regular worship service schedule beginning Sunday, September 8th with services at 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 am. Saturday evening services will continue at 5:00 p.m. Sunday School and Bible Classes will be at 9:15 a.m.

Church Council: Meets the 2nd Sunday of the month. Next meeting will be Sunday, September 8th at 7:00 p.m. all members of Trinity are invited to attend these meetings.

<u>Financial Secretary's and Treasurer's 2nd Quarter Report:</u> The congregation adopted a 2013 General Fund Budget of \$196,472 at its Annual Meeting on January 27. The Budget is 4.6% higher than contributions made to the General Fund in 2012. The Council deemed the increase warranted to cover expected higher operating costs. A modest salary increase of 2% was granted to Pastor, the Secretary, Organist and Choir Director. Primary support of the General Fund by the congregation is very important to meeting Trinity's ongoing needs.

During the quarter, all due bills were paid. Budgeted contributions were made to Missions and LCCF. Additionally, \$1,551.37 was given to Sow Hope, on behalf of Trinity members, as part of direct out-reach efforts. General Fund receipts were about 6% higher than those received during the first six months of last year. General Fund expenses were slightly higher than the budget for the same period. The balance on the original \$100,000 mortgage, used to finance the new restrooms, was \$17,976.57 at June 30. We want to thank everyone for their support of Trinity Lutheran Church and its missions. FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN FUNDRAISER In August, we completed our fundraising efforts for Feed My Starving Children. This involved a number of volunteer efforts from members of Trinity, with nearly 50 members of our congregation volunteering to pack meals as part of the Lincoln Way Area Mobile Pack. The goal of the event was to pack 272,000 meals at a total cost of \$60,000. When all was said and done, the total number of meals packed came to 279,936 and more than \$70,000 was raised - enough to cover the cost of ALL meals packed this year and to make a down payment on next year's efforts for this Christian charity.

Trinity partnered again this year with Good Shepherd Lutheran and was one of many area churches to lend a hand in this community-wide effort. In addition to our volunteers helping out in the packing of these meals, we also hosted a benefit concert on August 10th that featured music by Pastor Hoag and Dan Bay, a Bible-themed presentation by Skiddles the Clown and an ice cream social hosted by our own Social Ministry group. We had about 85 people attend the concert, which included a rousing rendition of Praise Be The Lord, with audience participation by our own Phil and Sharon McFarland. Christie Alfano also bravely volunteered to be outfitted with balloon armor during the concert. Concert attendees seemed to really enjoy the event, which is evidenced by pictures on display on our web site.

In the end, donations from our members combined with proceeds from the benefit concert amounted to a total donation from Trinity Lutheran Church to Feed My Starving Children of \$1,492.25! This concludes another church-wide effort to extend the reach of our congregation beyond the four walls of Trinity and into the community - this time going overseas to feed starving children around the globe! Our next fundraiser will focus on Morningstar Mission, another Christian-based organization that we have supported for a number of years. Many thanks to all those who pitched in to make this a success - please keep up your great work!


