Dear Friends of Trinity,

I want to introduce you to a new Missions funding initiative from the English District in which we will be participating.

It's called *A Dollar For Missions*. It's so easy you'll wonder why no one has thought of this before! Here's how it works:

One dollar per Baptized member per week. Simple!

Every weekend there will be a container in the hallway where donations can be made. Each week, all baptized members in attendance at church drop \$1 into the container. Week after week, for one calendar year, we'll do this.

Your participation is not mandatory. It's completely freewill. One dollar per baptized member per week. That's all. Participate as much or as little as you desire, or not at all. Age is not a factor. From the youngest to the oldest, baptized members of Trinity put in \$1 per week.

Is this a substitute for your regular offerings? Well, no. The funds that we raise go directly to English District mission projects. These funds are over and above your regular giving.

This initiative will begin in September, so watch for the container and display. I truly hope everyone gets involved. It might be fun for the little kids to drop a dollar into the box every week and will teach them the importance of giving.

I pray that our Lord will truly use the funds raised for the proclamation of His Gospel to the ends of the earth!

From Council President, Jeff McDonald

We have engaged Suevel Studios to begin the maintenance work on our stained-glass windows at Trinity. The goal here is to get the windows in working order and repair any existing damage to them that exists. We have a handful of panes with cracks in them and there are several places where the mortar needs to be replaced to prevent any further damage from being done. We hope to have this repair work done with minimal disruption to our members and we hope also that this does indeed buy us another 15 to 20 years before the full restoration of these windows is needed. The unknown in this equation is just what it will take to get the lower windows on the sides of the sanctuary functioning again, but that will be determined as the project moves along. Some may simply require lubrication while others are bound to require more extensive work. When the windows have been restored, please take care when opening and closing them to apply pressure solely to the window frames and not the window panes. While our stone walls in the sanctuary are extremely solid, the windows are comparatively much more fragile and should be handled as delicately as possible. This care will only prolong the life of the windows, allowing them to be enjoyed by future generations or years to come.

By now you have likely had a chance to see the new offices at Trinity as well as the new carpeting in the current library. I hope you like what you see! Personally, this project exceeded my expectations and I'm thrilled with the finished product. Rather than put the old television set back in the library along with the large table on which it sat, we are installing a flat screen television in that room that will give us a lot more space in the room and will also give us a better audio/visual option for any presentation that might require the use of a television screen. This update was an inexpensive one as the materials for it, including the television and wall mount, were donated to Trinity so this did not involve any additional expense for us thanks to the labor for the project also being donated by our property committee, who put a lot of sweat equity into this project. Please join me in thanking them for their efforts.

Next up is the kitchen remodel, as was mentioned in last month's newsletter. We want to make sure we aren't taking on a bigger project than we intend to here, so we will be working with the Village and other officials to make sure we can simply update the kitchen without having to undertake any more extensive upgrades to our existing space. Assuming that is a go, we will be exploring this project further over the next couple of months with the goal of moving

forward with it as soon as possible. If you have an eye for design and have ideas for an effective layout in that room, please contact me as we are very open to member input on how to make this kitchen more useful for all of us.

Last, I want to give you a quick overview of the money associated with some of these projects. We raised about \$50,000 for our windows and we expect to spend no more than half of that amount on the current maintenance work (ideally, we would like to keep this under \$20,000 in total, but we won't know for sure until the work is started). That means we should have close to \$30,000 available now for the kitchen. Early estimates, which were admittedly pretty rough, were that the kitchen might run close to \$35,000 to remodel. Like any other project in a building as old as ours, though, there are likely to be added costs as we go along. Surprises are rarely a good thing in the context of remodeling, yet they are regrettably common in older buildings like ours. Assuming we stay on budget, that means we would be about \$5,000 short for these two projects. If push comes to shove, we have funds available to us to cover this, but then that would deplete our window fund as well. So I will close by asking you all to consider any funding of this project that you are moved to provide. If we are able to complete the window maintenance work and the kitchen and have funds left over at the end, they will be designated to go right back into the stained-glass repair fund for use when the full window restoration is done. I never cease to be amazed by the generosity of our congregation and I try to limit my begging to only the larger projects. We are currently debt free as a result of the generosity of our members and our adherence to the idea that we don't spend money that we don't have. I hope you all agree that our physical plant at Trinity is in great shape and that the changes we're making at the church are beneficial to all of us. Whether it is the new lift, the new exterior railing and stairs, the new sidewalk, the new gym windows, the new organ, the new air conditioning units, the new offices, or something not on this list, we have evidence of the improvements we've made all around us at Trinity and I hope you are enjoying them as much as I am. I am hopeful that the fellowship hall kitchen remodel project will be our last one for a good while, so I will close by asking you to consider supporting this project between now and the end of the year. If we can complete this project and retain a decent fund for our stained-glass windows, I believe we will be in excellent shape.
